To ensure a more stable vaccine supply, a portfolio of six vaccine varieties is now being negotiated with the manufacturers.

- 1. Pfizer/BioNTech
- 2. Novavax/Covovax (Serum Institute of India)
- 3. Moderna
- 4. Coronavac (Sinovac)
- 5. Janssen /Johnson & Johnson
- 6. Sputnik-V (Gamaleya)

We chose to finance majority of our funding for the COVID-19 vaccination program through loans from multilateral partners to assure the public of two things:

- 1. The vaccines we buy are internationally accepted, and have passed the stringent criteria for safety and effectiveness.
- 2. The vaccine procurement is totally transparent.
